Preventative Measures to H1N1

1. Restrooms are stocked with non-antimicrobial hand washing soap and disposable towels.
2. Waterless hand sanitizer and boxes of facial tissue have been placed in each classroom and at individual work tables.
3. Posters have been placed throughout the building reminding of and encouraging healthy habits.
4. Promote and ensure the cleaning of commonly used items in the workplace and classrooms (doorknobs, light switches, etc.).
5. We encourage catechists and students to stay at home if they are experiencing influenza-related symptoms (fever, cough, sore throat, headache, nasal congestion, muscle aches, and sometimes upset stomach).
6. If you or your child has influenza you should remain at home for 7 days or until 24 hours after symptoms are gone. A public inquiry line is available 8:00AM-8:00PM for questions at **1-888-330-6764**.

Response to School Closures

1. In the event the Hampstead School District announces school closures in response to confirmed or probable cases of H1N1, then all religious education programs will close.
2. Religious Education closures will be announced in the same way they are for weather-related closures.
3. These closures will remain as long as the Hampstead School District Schools remain closed.
4. The announcement to reopen religious education programs will take affect when the Hampstead School District reopens schools.
